

## Illumina Privacy Transparency Report 2023

## Overview

Transparency and accountability are two of Illumina's fundamental <u>Privacy Principles</u>. Consistent with these principles, our annual Transparency Report summarizes any requests we receive from law enforcement agencies for the disclosure of genomic information as well as any national security related requests.

Illumina is a U.S. company with international <u>offices</u> and a global customer base. If we receive a request for the disclosure of genomic information from an international law enforcement agency, we will follow the same standards we have set for U.S. law enforcement agencies. This includes abiding by our Privacy Principles, Privacy Policy, and requiring requests to be legally valid and specific.
